What's this you may ask?

I thought it might be fun to put together a double elimination tournament of all the SCL World Series Champions to determine the best SCL team of all-time.

How's it going to work?

Each World Series Champion from 1910-1933 (That's a lot of Gorillas, Tide, Stogies, and Warbirds) was randomly placed into one of 2 blocks. There have been 24 World Series played with the AL winning 15 of them, so I couldn't evenly distribute AL vs NL.

The team with the earliest Championship would then be matched up against the latest World Series Champion in each block. If it happened to be the same franchise the next available Champion would be selected.

BLOCK #1- 1914 Skeeters vs 1933 Warbirds (Wonderful!) Etc etc.

BLOCK #2- 1910 Gorillas vs 1932 Vipers Etc etc

The winner of the 1st game in each block will play a game #1 winner. The earliest winner vs the latest winner. Unless it is a team from the same franchise. The same in the losers bracket. My Goal is to avoid the same franchise playing itself as long as possible. The Final 2 teams could end up being the 1926 Stogies vs the 1924 Stogies. Hopefully that doesn't happen. Home and away games will be reversed as well.

The lineups used will be the same as each team used in the World Series. I'm setting up each team with a 3-man rotation, as well as the LHP/RHP lineups and Manager tendencies used in that World Series. I'll be using the Golden Age Era 1920-1940 to simulate the games.

Two losses and your out. The final Series will be a best of 5.
