## What's News:

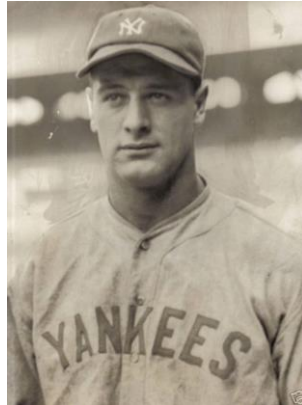
On opening day Ty Cobb(Crimson Tide) singled and scored on a Frankie Frisch home run. That was his 1500<sup>th</sup> run scored in the SCL. At the end of this week's games Eddie Collins(Storm) sits at 1487 runs scored. Ty Cobb had 7 hits in his 3 games played, giving him 2892 in his SCL career.

In the 1<sup>st</sup> doubleheader ever played in the SCL the Aggies swept the Robins. They got a 1-0 4-hit shutout from Virgil Barnes in Game #1, and they overcame a Turkey Stearnes Grand Slam in Game #2, on a 2 out 2 run single by Lu Blue in the 8<sup>th</sup> inning.

**NOTE:** I will generally be playing 5 days' worth of games every Mon/Wed/Fri. With the inclusion of doubleheaders this season, it may be less. The 4<sup>th</sup> of July slate has 14 games scheduled that day. I'll let you know the total days' worth of games previous to each night of play.

You must have at least 22 active players, including 2 catchers, and 6 pitchers. 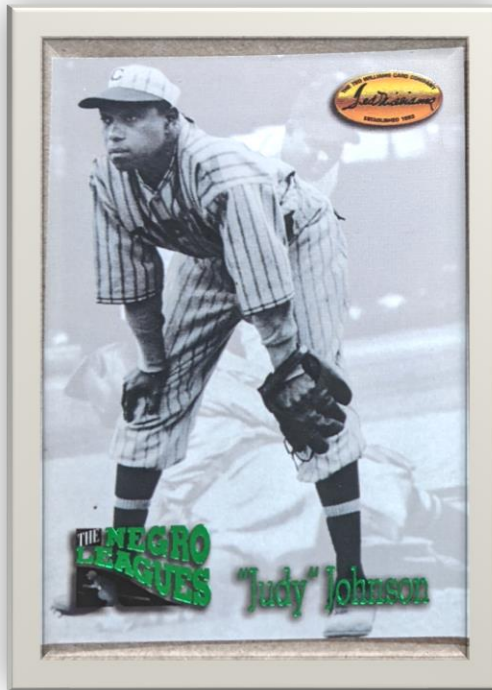

## Card of The Week:



**Judy Johnson-Peoria Caterpillars**

**William J “Judy” Johnson is currently manning the Hot Corner for the Peoria Caterpillars. In 1923 Johnson hit .231/.273/.299 with 7 HRs and 89 rbi in 154 games. Not too good, but better things are coming for this 1975 Hall of Fame inductee.**

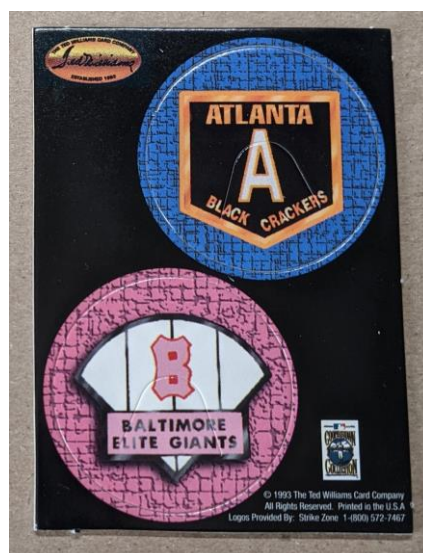
**Judy Johnson played from 1919-1936, primarily with the Hilldale Club(12 seasons) and the Pittsburgh Crawfords, teaming up with Josh Gibson, Cool Papa Bell and Satchel Paige.**

**This card is from the Ted Williams Card Company from 1993. There was a set released in 1993 and 1994 and is noteworthy for it’s inclusion of Negro League players(18), while also including a lot of Hall of Famers and other notable players. Bud Harrelson, Ron Cey and Bill Buckner appeared along side Ted Williams, Willie Mays, Rogers Hornsby, Lou Brock, and everybody’s favorite, Bobby Murcer.**

**The set also included 4 players from the All-American Girls’ Professional Baseball League. Lefty Hohlmeyer, Dotty Kamenshek, Pepper Davis, and Marge Wenzell.**

**Several other subsets included: Ted’s Greatest Hitters, Barrier Breakers, Etched in Stone, and The Locklear Collection, featuring the original artwork of former Major Leaguer Gene Locklear. Of which I have none.**

**Each pack had a POGs insert, mostly featuring team logos of both MLB and Negro Leagues teams.**



**POGs were collectible “milk caps”?? used in game play that were popular in the 90s with the kids. There is actually a World POG Federation. Back in the 70s we grew our hair long and wore bell-bottoms. Children of the 90s were just plain weird.**
