If a Negro League player exceeds any of these stats, they will be adjusted to align with these numbers.

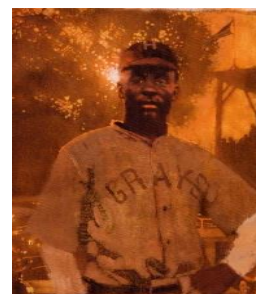

In the 11th with 2 outs and a runner on 2nd Heinie Manush delivered again with a game winning rbi single.

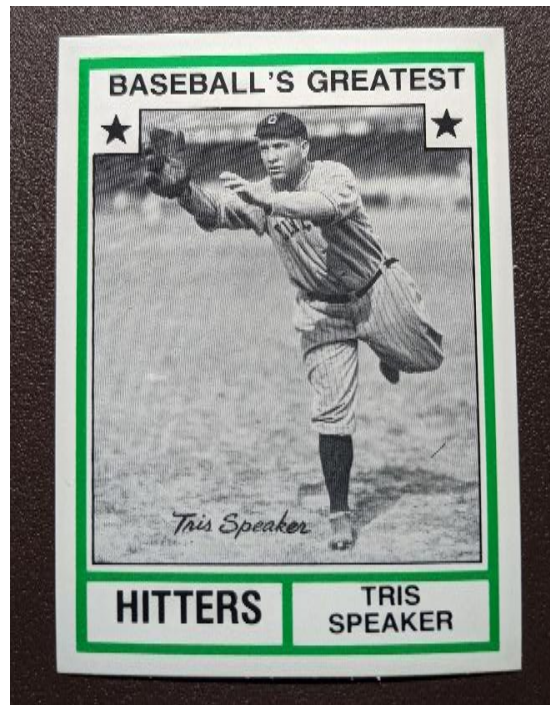

Tris Speaker-Peoria Caterpillars

This is a TCMA Baseball's Greatest Hitters card issued in 1982. This set was released along with a Greatest Pitchers and Greatest Sluggers set, each consisting of 43 cards. This is the Tris Speaker card #18 of the Hitters set.

TCMA stands for the founders of the company, Tom Collier and Michael Aronstein. They started releasing vintage sets in the 70's and continued to do so into the middle 80's. They were going up against the Topps juggernaut and went retro with some success. No splash, no dash, no 3D, chrome or hologram, just vintage photos of vintage players. My opinion, retro always works with baseball cards.

I own all 3 sets of the Greatest Hitters/Pitchers/and Sluggers, and they are currently listed at around \$10 per set on Ebay. I think I paid \$12 for all 3 sets, so I'm close to tripling my investment. I am the J. Paul Getty of baseball cards!!

On this card Tris Speaker is trying and failing to look like a ball player trying to catch a fly ball. To his credit, almost every posed shot looks like this one, so his lack of grace or evident athletic skill on this card is par for the course.

Tris Speaker has been in the SCL since its inception in 1910, and he has manned centerfield for the Peoria Caterpillars for his entire career. He has a .328 lifetime average and is closing in on 600 career doubles. He is a 2x Honus Wagner Award winner. (1913, 1916) He has led the league in hitting 2x, hitting .368 in 1913, and .380 in 1916. He is 12x All-Star and along with Gavy Cravath they are the only players with at least 1-double, triple and Home Run in the All-Star game.
