


What's News:

Because MLB went all *Field of Dreams* this week, I thought I'd give Moonlight Graham his second chance.



Ludwig van Beethovan

Yes I have a Beethoven baseball card. This baby was issued by Topps in its Allen & Ginter's set in 2009. Some of the other non-baseball player cards include Napoleon, Abraham Lincoln, Amelia Earhart, and Edgar Allen Poe. Some non-existent representatives feature Bigfoot, Yeti, Loch Ness Monster, and a chupacabra.(AKA the goat-sucker)

I grew up listening to opera. My father was a huge fan, and he sang in the local opera group for years, as well as several choral groups. He had a very nice Irish tenor voice. I listened to as much Luciano Pavarotti, Placido Domingo, Beverly Sills, and Maria Callas as I did Elvis and the Beatles. I hated it....still do.

When I was around 13 I remember watching 2001: A Space Odyssey, and when the monolith was discovered by the chimps and the now iconic background music began to play I was awestruck by what I was hearing. It's not really opera...opera sucks... but this is cool...what is it? My father hooked me up with some Richard Strauss, *Thus Spoke Zarathustra*, and for me, the rest is non opera, classical musical history. Beethoven, Wagner, Bach, Mozart and Tchaikovsky were Rock and Roll before there was Rock and Roll. Listen to Beethoven's *Ode to Joy* and you'll understand.

Beethoven composed some of his best works after gradually losing his hearing in his 20's. He has a crater on Mercury named after him. That's Rock and Roll. I'm pretty sure Elvis doesn't have a crater named after him.
