ley have a wonderful life.



The screenplay for the movie was written by Bill Lancaster, son of Burt Lancaster, AKA Moonlight Graham.

The Bad News Bears came out in April of 1976. I was getting ready to graduate High School, and would very shortly be voted on Class Day, "Most Likely To Die a Virgin". (And yes, they were wrong, but at the time I thought they were spot on.)

I really liked this movie, and still do. I never related to Kelly Leake, Ahmad, Ogilvie, Engleberg, Lupus or Amanda. Out of all the players on the Bears, I related to Tanner Boyle. An undersized Little Leaguer with a mop of blonde hair, and an oversized sense of self.(This sense of self only showed up on the ball field for me. Off the field I was a little tiny ball of insecurities.) My coach in Little league was nothing like Coach Buttermaker. He once said "Golly" and everybody's head turned. He would sit in the dugout and drink hot tea. He brought his own tea set! He used sugar cubes! He used little tongs to put them in his cup!

Does the movie hold up? If you get past the 70's racism, homophobia, and misogyny, it's still funny, it's still relatable, and when you throw in the two dumpster fire sequels, it looks like top-notch comedy gold.
