

### What's News:

The 1925 Hall Of Fame ballot is completed. You guys are tough. I would think that Sherry Magee(the SCL's 1st Hitter of The Year Recipient), Honus Wagner(The Hitter of The Year award is named after him!), and Sam Crawford(144 career triples, plus every Hall of Fame needs a Wahoo in it) would get more love. Jimmy Lyons got a lot of votes, he has some really nice numbers, but he had just 3 of 12 seasons where he appeared in over 120 games. In 7 seasons he didn't reach 80 games. I know what you're saying. "If he's on the ballot I can vote for him." I totally agree.

In the 1<sup>st</sup> ballot we were tasked with 10 votes, while this last one was just 5. I think we'll settle on 8 votes for all future HOF ballots. This leaves some room for sentimental picks(Buck Weaver), pioneer picks(Wagner) HOF worthy picks, but I'm not picking him because I don't like him picks(Heinie Zimmerman) and HOF worthy picks, which this year equaled "zero."

The 1<sup>st</sup> no-hiiter of 1925, and just the 2<sup>nd</sup> since Dave Brown's(Pines) no-hitter in the 1920 World Series.

The Gorillas managed to score a run on an error by Newt Joseph at 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2 walks and an rbi groundout. Benton also managed 3 hits of his own, raising his season average up to .424.

This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> no-hitter for the Skeeters. Babe Adams(1910) and String Bean Williams(1918) tossed the other two. It was also the 20<sup>th</sup> no-hitter in SCL history.

More research on SCL no-hitters seems like a worthy project for an upcoming newsletter.

**Card of The Week:** 



Dick Howser- Will never play in the SCL.

Thank you David Kuehn(whose last name I misspell every time.) for sending this 1987 Topps card in. If you're like me, whenever a manager card showed up in my pack of Topps, I felt like I was getting ripped off. I never considered that the vast majority of these guys were former ball players. For me they were just some old guy wearing a jacket.

Howser played 8 seasons in MLB, playing with the Kansas City A's, Indians and Yankees. He was an All Star in his rookie season and came in 2<sup>nd</sup> for Rookie of the Year, behind Don Schwall in 1961. He never came close to his 1961 totals of .280/.377/.362 with 37 stolen bases, mostly due to recurring injuries. He retired from playing after the 1968 season.

He was hired by George Steinbrenner as Yankee manager in 1980 and he proceeded to lead the Yankees to a 103 win season. After losing to the Royals in the ALCS, Steinbrenner fired him, because Steinbrenner's a dick. Howser went on to manage the Royals for 6 seasons, winning a World Series in 1985. In 1986 he managed the Royals for half a season, stepping down in July due to severe headaches brought on by a brain tumor. After several operations, and other experimental treatments including injection of cancer-killing lymphocytes, Howser passed away on June 17, 1987. He was just 51 years old. I always rooted for the Howser managed Royals....because Steinbrenner was a dick.

Because Dick Howser debuted in 1961 he will never get a chance to play in the SCL. At our current pace 1961 wouldn't happen until 2035. I would be 76 years old, muddle headed, and living on vanilla pudding. Actually, not much different from 2021, just less hair.
