Card of The Week:






This is a 1910 E91 American Caramel of Bob Groom. This set included 33 baseball players including Honus Wagner, Tris Speaker, and Walter Johnson. Besides the fact that it doesn't look anything like Bob Groom, I think they went a little heavy on the lipstick; a problem with several cards in the set.

This is a t-206 card of Groom, (A reprint that I own)that has the same lame pose as the Turkey Red.



This is a Bob Groom card that I actually have from the Conlon Collection. The best looking card I could find.(Don't let my photography skills fool you. More like my lack of photography skills.) It's a pretty good photograph by Conlon. This honors the no-hitter that Groom tossed vs the eventual Champion 1917 White Sox. After pitching 2 no hit innings in relief in the 1st game of a doubleheader, he tossed his no-hitter in the 2nd game, adding up to 11 consecutive no hit innings on the day. Not too shabby.
