

Jose Mendez pitched 7 innings of no-hit ball, then 2 rain delays forced him out of the game. George Harney was brought in to pitch the 8th. After getting the 1st 2 batters out he walked pinch hitter Johnson Hill, bringing Bob McClure into the game. He coaxed Ray Powell into an infield pop out to end the 8th and keep the no-hitter alive. Johnny Mitchell led off the 9th by grounding a single between 3rd and short to break up the no-no. McClure struck out Bubbles Hargrave to end the inning, finishing off the combined 1 hit shut out for the Storm.





Card of The Week:



Peaches Graham(Warriors, Skeeters, Wolverines)

George Frederick "Peaches" Graham played 7 seasons in MLB, primarily as a catcher. He had a lifetime average of .282 with just 1 home run. He hit that dinger off Rube Marquard in 1912. Peaches Graham played 3 seasons in the SCL, one each with the Warriors, Skeeters, and the Wolverines. He hit .286 in his SCL career, with just one home run, also hit in 1912. Oddly similar. I looked up his game logs for 1912, just to see if he hit that home run off of Rube Marquard. How *Twilight Zone* would that have been? Unfortunately he hit his home run off of Terrapins' pitcher Tom Hughes. So more like an episode of *The Facts of Life*. The one where Tootey loses her retainer, and she's freak-ing out, only to find out Blair had it all the time. Those crazy kids!!

The above card is a reprint I own of Peaches' T206 card.

There have been around 18 players in MLB with the last name of Graham. The latest being J.R. Graham, a pitcher for the Twins in 2015/2016. He compiled a 1-1 record with a 5.10 ERA in 65 IP. He joins the likes of Tiny Graham, Skinny Graham, Moonlight Graham, and the aforementioned Peaches Graham in the exclusive Graham MLB Club.

George Graham supposedly got his nickname while playing in Colorado Springs, Teammate Bunk Congalton dared him to eat a bucket of peaches. No word on whether George was successful, but he went on to get 9 hits over the next 4 games, so George started eating a peach before every game for good luck, and Peaches Graham was born. Lucky for Peaches that Bunk didn't dare him to eat a bucket of pig's feet. Pig's Feet Graham would have been an unfortunate nickname.
